A flurry of responses to the preface of New Jerusalem Times
7 June 2018 AD



This forum was deliberately mooted by our presiding pastor to exercise our faculties for spiritual understanding and edification. He had activated the forum by the query he had dispatched after the NJT with the said preface, "What is your thought on the preface of NJT 7 June 2018 AD?"

"Dear pastor, just an update: the last 2 days, we conducted Bible study mainly for the Telugu-speaking folks. Samuel Devashahayam has been the interpreter. The Telugu speaking folks had difficulty grasping the deep concept of estate of man in relation to the topic on Justification by Grace (legal basis - atonement) so we had to spend 2 sessions on this objective truth - 'how can a man be justified with God?' We will continue on the subjective aspect of 'when' this Friday in Cephas' house. Our young brethren also joined in and it is a good revision for them to understand this doctrine. Today I continued on the conveyance of your message on Proverbs Part 2 especially for the sake of the young people and our brethren here on finding the true church in the book of Proverbs. Jonathan Debbarma, a young man who worked in a restaurant was ministered by the message that he wants to take leave tomorrow to follow us to an outreach. Please pray for us as we will be spending a day in a village which is a few hours away from Hyderabad to minister to a family of a pastor who is the only one remaining in this outreach ministry. Try to amend as conveniently as possible and rally our leaders with David Debbarma. Rhoda, we are not there on a tour to visit places, we are there to execute our mandate! Those who are with us as an integral part of our ministry will help us prosecute our mission, which is to warn all people of the second coming of our Lord and to restore all things according to the Scriptures!! Only for tomorrow it is too late to change the schedule." Rhoda; 6 June. Pastor's outrage at many delegations dispatched overseas and the leaders and representatives of our ministry in foreign lands who unwisely mix the special mandate and the Great Commission, though he had reiterated the distinction and differences again and again. Many of our brethren who deputise him abuse and convey his teachings and try to begin their own churches, ministries and kingdoms. They are fulfilling their own agendas instead! Pastor had addressed this problem very clearly even in the recent China conference but unfortunately many brethren who do not have enough of the grey matter nor sufficient spiritual acumen nor special anointing act as though the corpus of doctrines he had given to them were their own derived understanding. Pastor had affirmed what he proclaims and warns people all over the world is not novel but given to him by the clear and special illumination of the Holy Spirit to reassert and underscore what our Lord, Paul, the Apostles, the Church Fathers, the Protestant Reformers, the quintessential Puritans and the 18th century Calvinistic Revivalists had faithfully declared. Our restoration is founded on the Historic Faith of our covenantally faithful forebears. It is based on experimental Calvinisim as opposed to Roman Catholicism, Arminianism, Dispensationalism, Pentecostalism, Charismaticism and other modern day heresies. FORWARD

After I mooted a forum in our internet site, the responses came in as a flux fast and furious. It was not just a burst but a gushing cascade. However, as I surveyed the barrage of reactions, it was not easy to be encouraged. The heaviness in my heart was hardly assuaged as the floods of mist and murk had barely abated.

Only a handful could actually understand with lucidity and clarity the issues that I had addressed in my blurb (New Jerusalem Times 7 June 2018 AD). The recent preaching from the books of Wisdom Literature perhaps explained the muddled thinking. The voice of Wisdom amidst a cacophony of noises is barely discerned and heard. Perplexity and fuzziness still prevail among the best of God's people. If true wisdom, integrity and intelligence is found lacking among God's own people, who have the benefit of being specially grafted and nurtured, what of the heathen groomed in ungodly, liberal and pagan values?

But still the net effect of perusing through this spree of responses could be spiritually profitable, if God would mercifully grant His help and grace. O that God would be gracious and pitiful towards us.

The tragic fact is that a good number of God's people do not have spiritual capacity to receive spiritual things and appreciate their own deficiencies and flaws. It could be eternally lethal if some of these deficiencies are actually defectivenesses. When we are blind, we cannot see our own deadly flaws. Yet we refuse to acknowledge our blindness. We are reminded of our Lord's searching words, "If ye were blind, ye should have no sin: but now ye say, We see; therefore your sin remaineth." (John 9:41). Conceit is the worst form of sin. It is an evil cocktail of arrogance, deceit, unbelief and impenitence. Again our Lord had said, "He that is of God heareth God's words: ye therefore hear them not, because ye are not of God." (John 8:47)

It is not my intention to generate discord, fear and disturbance. For we consider what Ahab the king of degenerate Israel who wrought apostasy to its peak in his days; Ahab had the temerity to ridicule the prophet of God, "Art thou he that troubleth Israel?" (I Kings 18:17). Elijah of old replied, "I have not troubled Israel; but thou, and thy father's

house, in that ye have forsaken the commandments of the LORD, and thou hast followed Baalim." (I Kings 18:18). The trouble is that too many of us are living for the applause of men and seeking for temporal recompence. The Baalims of the day are the liberal, modern and sophisticated lifestyles and cultures of ultra-urban societies. We love pleasures and leisures more than God. "For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, ..." (II Timothy 3:2). We may well be part of the fulfilment of the prophecy of Paul. "Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth." (II Timothy 3:7).

While we may be able to utter a multitude of words, we fail to take the caution that we may not be expressing our obedience of faith but rather our vagueness, ambiguities, perplexities, confusion, nebulousness and ignorance of the truth. It is the sheer mercy of God that we are not confounded and consumed.

Thank God, there are some whose contributions that are edifying and enlightening. They are like stars that twinkle in the midst of the pitch darkness of apostasy, unbelief and worldliness. Let the twinkling stars across the firmament of apostasy blaze themselves upon our souls wherein darkness seek to conquer and dominate and dispel abroad the evil pall of gloom and doom. Let us each know perfectly what the will of God is for our lives and let us stand faithfully before the sight of Christ.

"I find the exchange between yourself and Rhoda makes a lot of sense. Since she is adept in your doctrines and is able to teach the teachers, then it is inefficient for her to spend her time with the spiritually weak and those like the Telugu speaking who have difficulty grasping deep doctrine. I do wonder though whether those who have weaker minds may nevertheless be permitted by the mercies of God to grasp experimental Calvinism faster than the elite and whether there is some justification to condescend to those who are spiritually hungry but not so intellectually capable. The editorial commentary you wrote underneath this exchange is much harder to digest. I am sure I am one with whom you are outraged which is why you are soliciting my response. I feel convicted over my lack of fervency to preach instantly, in season and out and to preach repentance - for Christ shall return and judge the quick and the dead. I'm not convicted that I have abused your teachings. The biggest apparent contradiction I struggle to make sense of is this: If the corpus of doctrines the Holy Spirit has given you illumination to understand are not novel, but those of our Lord, Paul, the Apostles, the Church Fathers etc, then in what way are they yours? Credit normally goes to the first and not to the last. Though any steward must vigorously defend them, he is nevertheless the steward and not the owner. Therefore I do not understand why the principle of 'freely ye have received, freely give' is not in operation. I cannot help but feel that I was given your doctrines conditionally and that having failed to meet those conditions I must relinquish your doctrines. But if they are truth, how should I relinquish them? Again, if they are truth, how is it sin to make them my own? And if I have drawn from the wells of the historic faith then how can I call that doctrine 'Elijah Thomas Chacko's doctrine' which I know to have been (e.g.) John Bunyan's also? In a similar vein, I find it very hard to reconcile the statement 'everything you have learned, you received from me' with the constant exhortation to 'search the Scriptures'. The latter presupposes we may all be taught of God to a greater or lesser degree. These are some of my thoughts on the preface dated 7th June AD 2018, pastor. "Dear pastor, thanks for the WhatsApp. Sorry not to have replied more promptly. It was too hard to squeeze my thoughts into a text message, and I didn't get finished up at work, then at home, until pretty late. The first time I read the 7th NJT I felt some surprise that you polarised this issue into one of fulfilling either the special mandate, or the Great Commission, but on reflection I think I could see both the pertinence and the urgency of making a very clear distinction. For a while I have wondered what exactly are the covenantal obligations upon us. One could argue that the Great Commission is to make all men Christ's disciples, and so it encompasses the effective worldwide preaching of both the law and the Gospel. I see, however, that because we have understood from you the degree of restoration that is required among those who have forgotten the law of Moses (i.e. Protestant Christendom) it is inadequate and a waste to pursue activities which do not further this mandate. I guess this is particularly true of those who represent you, who visibly share in your calling. However, a measure of responsibility lies with all of us. It is certainly tempting in UK/Europe, where there are major barriers to the acceptance of certain doctrines, (especially the anointed ministry and the ministry of the law) to conclude that it is enough to bring across a certain quantum of truth from the Scriptures and to feel that we still have some kind of role therein. However, I feel clear now that the blessings and mercies of God in our times are overwhelmingly conferred through this ministry. It is a ministry of restoration, especially among the so-called Protestant circle and our focus should not be reaching out to the unbelievers.
