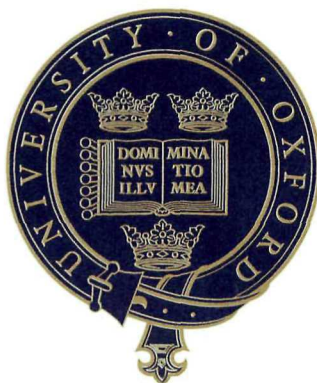

Your marks were:

Morphology	50
Physiology & Pharmacology	46.7
Biochemistry	53.3

These marks match up to some extent with some of your work during the year, but sometimes you do so much better that I'm sure you are not yet doing yourself justice. Of course, I am glad, very glad, that you passed in all subjects (a good many didn't), and the fact that you had a viva along with so many others does not fuss me. But I do feel that you are worth better than this, and I hope you will take a measure of confidence and determination from my view and do better next time round.
